Environmental Strategy

Statement of Intent

Further to the above strategy, and the need to ensure compliance with all relevant environmental legislation, regulation, and approved codes of practice, Capstone Construction will strive to:

- Continuously seek to improve environmental performance by measuring our overall carbon footprint, setting realistic targets and objectives, and reviewing progress on a regular basis
- Prevent any pollution which may arise from our activities
- Improve procurement practises to ensure the legality of our timber and timber-based products
- Actively encourage our suppliers and sub-contractors to promote responsible attitudes towards the natural environment
- Take positive action to reduce, reuse and recycle in order to minimise both operational costs and any negative effect on non-sustainable natural resources. Areas of improvement shall include, but not be limited to: raw material usage, packaging waste, timber waste, alternatives to landfill and reuse of excavated materials
- Monitor energy usage including electricity, water and heating sources, emissions to air and water and use of fuel required for our fleet with the view to reducing this wherever economically viable
- Ensure this policy and associated process documentation is effectively communicated to all employees, displayed on each site noticeboard, and made available to other interested parties upon request
- Provide information, instruction, training, and supervision to ensure that employees are able to discharge their duties effectively

To seek continual improvement, and assist in the implementation of this Policy, we will utilise external support as appropriate and seek advice on environmental matters from our appointed competent personnel.
